

Child Safe Reporting Process

Who Can Report? Parent Child Volunteer Staff

What to Report?

Any child safety concerns, including:

- · Disclosure of abuse or harm
- Allegation, suspicion or observation of any abuse
- Breach of Code of Conduct
- Environmental safety issues.

When to Report?

Call 000 if a child is in immediate danger

All incidents should be reported that day.

How?

What Happens Next?

We will:

- Offer support to the person who makes a report and to the accused individual (this may be a separate staff member)
- Decide, in accordance with legal requirements and duty of care, whether the matter should/must be reported to the police or Child Protection and make report as soon as possible if required.
- Initiate internal processes to ensure the safety of the child, clarify the nature of the complaint and commence disciplinary process (if required)
- Follow step as outlined in the SPBA Member Protection Policy and Child Safe Policy
- Liaise with Basketball Victoria to provide advice regarding the situation.









Outcome

- Investigation Internal or external depending on the nature of the complaint;
- Outcome decided;
- Relevant staff, volunteers, parents and child notified of outcome of investigation;
- Policies & procedures updated where necessary.
